

PRIVATE FISH POND CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION GUIDELINES

APPLICATIONS:

Applications for a private fish pond Certificate of Registration (COR) are available at the following Utah Division of Wildlife Resources offices:

Each application must be accompanied by a \$10 nonrefundable handling fee **AND** \$100 nonrefundable inspection fee. When an application is approved, applicant will be billed \$75 and the COR will be issued upon receipt of that amount.

Up to 45 days may be required to issue a COR. Please plan ahead; we'll make every effort to inspect your pond and issue your COR as soon as we can.

POND INSPECTION:

All ponds must be inspected by Division of Wildlife Resources personnel before a Certificate of Registration is issued to confirm that adequate screening is installed and that the pond is not on a natural stream. Because of snow and ice, winter inspections are often impossible. If you want to stock early in the spring it might be helpful to have your pond inspected in the fall before winter sets in.

Ponds are re-inspected every six years.

WHY DOES THE DIVISION OF WILDLIFE RESOURCES REQUIRE A COR?

To assure protection of wild fish populations, the Division of Wildlife Resources requires people to get approval before they can stock fish in a private pond.

1. **Disease:** FISH MAY BE OBTAINED ONLY FROM SOURCES, EITHER INSTATE OR OUT OF STATE, WHICH HAVE BEEN HEALTH APPROVED BY THE FISH HEALTH APPROVAL BOARD (DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE) AND ASSIGNED A FISH HEALTH APPROVAL NUMBER. Fish moved from one location to another can carry diseases that harm and kill wild fish. Some diseases such as whirling disease can infect an area forever. Fish in crowded pond conditions are more susceptible to disease. The Utah Department of Agriculture (801-538-7029) can provide names of health approved sources once you have been issued a private fish pond COR.
2. **Competition:** Some fish compete directly with wild fish for food and living space. They may also prey on other aquatic species. For example, brook trout outcompete cutthroat trout, leading to the loss of cutthroat trout populations in some areas.
3. **Interbreeding:** Some species will hybridize with other species. If rainbow trout were stocked

into a drainage with a rare native cutthroat trout, they could interbreed and eventually lead to the loss of the native cutthroat trout population.

The Division of Wildlife Resources needs to maintain control over the movement of fish in Utah to protect wild fish in public waters for the citizens of Utah.

IMPORTATION OF FISH FROM OUT OF STATE:

The importation of fish into Utah from another state requires:

1. prior authorization from the Division through its Wildlife Registration Office (the fee for each importation amendment is \$10); and
2. an entry permit from the Utah State Department of Agriculture (801-538-7046).

BASIC REQUIREMENTS FOR PRIVATE FISH PONDS:

Two main requirements that must be met before a private fish pond COR will be issued:

1. ***No private pond can be constructed on a natural flowing stream (Utah Code 23-15-10).***
2. ***Inflows (except springs) and outflows of ponds are required to be screened to prevent migration of fish in and out of the pond.***

Ponds that are not adequately screened to prevent fish escapement **will not** be approved. Temporary screens are not acceptable. Screens need to be installed so they can be cleaned.

Screens must have small enough mesh to prevent the smallest fish in your pond from escaping. With catchable sized trout (8-10 inches) we recommend ½ inch heavy wire mesh. Screens can also be built with vertical bars placed close enough to each other so that fish cannot squeeze between them. Vertical bars installed on a slant, angling down stream will aid the current in pushing debris to the surface for easy removal. Bars can also be raked and easily cleaned.

RENEWAL OF CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION:

The certificate of registration for a private fish pond is renewable annually upon submission of a \$40.00 renewal fee (\$10 nonrefundable handling fee and \$30 renewal fee) and "Annual Report of Live Fish Acquired." If the renewal request and annual report are not received on or before January 30 (of the year of expiration), a \$10 late fee will be assessed. If the renewal request is not received within 30 days of January 30 (of the year or expiration), the application will be treated as a new (initial application) and initial fees will apply. An additional fee of \$100 will be assessed every six years for re-inspection of the pond.
