SUBJECT: West Desert, Deep Creek bull elk hunting.

The DWR is requesting an extension to the timeline for the transition of the West Desert, Deep Creek unit to a general season, Any Bull unit.

The West Desert, Deep Creek unit is currently managed as a limited entry unit for bull elk and managed under the September archery and HAMSS hunting strategy. During the statewide elk plan revision in the fall of 2022, the DWR recommended converting this unit to a general season Any Bull hunting strategy. A substantial portion of the elk habitat on the Deep Creek mountain range is comprised of tribal trust lands belonging to the Confederated Tribes of the Goshute Reservation (CTGR). In the Nov./Dec. 2022 RAC and Wildlife Board meetings the CTGR voiced serious concerns about the proposed change. The Wildlife Board voted to delay the transition to Any Bull hunting on the Deep Creek unit until the 2024 hunting season. This delay was granted to allow the DWR and the GTGR more time to work through concerns and resolve issues. The DWR strives to be a good neighbor and partner and wants to have meaningful consultation and collaboration with the CTGR.

Despite ongoing efforts by both the DWR and the CTGR, there are still substantial, unresolved concerns around the conversion of this unit to Any Bull. The DWR is requesting the Wildlife Board grant additional time before conversion of the Deep Creek unit for both parties to work through these concerns and find a reasonable path forward. If additional time is allotted, the DWR will re-visit bull elk hunting status on the Deep Creek unit with the Wildlife Board at the first statewide elk plan mid-plan review. That mid-plan review is planned to occur after the 2025 hunting season.
