
2010-2011 Bobcat Recommendation Summary:

- The Division is recommending a 1 permit reduction from 4 to 3, a one week delay in the season from 11/24/2010 to 12/01/2010 and capping the number of permits at 4,600. This recommendation is in accordance with the Utah Bobcat Management Plan.
 - All 4 indicator variables in the Bobcat Management Plan indicate a decreasing population.
 - o According to the management plan when 4 variables indicate a decreasing population the number of permits / individual is to be reduced by 1 or 2, the season length is to be shortened by 1 or 2 weeks and the number of permits are to be capped at 80% of the permits sold the previous year.

2010-2011 Furbearer Recommendation Summary:

- 1. Require a Furbearer License before temporary bobcat permits can be purchased (consistent with other species).
- 2. Require the name and address of the trapper who has another individual transport bobcat and marten in addition to current requirements in the Guidebook.
- 3. Remove seven and add three new sites to the beaver trapping closure list in the Guidebook.
 - a. Remove the following sites from the list:
 - i. Indian Peaks WMA (Beaver County)
 - ii. North fork Gordon Creek upstream of Coal Canyon Road (Carbon County)
 - iii. Beaver Creek drainage of the Price River (Carbon County)
 - iv. Land east of SR-150 and south of USFS roads 058, 072, 017 and 077, referred to as North Slope Road (Summit County)
 - v. Echo Creek upstream of the Weber River (Summit County)
 - vi. USFS Desert Exp. Station (Millard County)
 - vii. Green River from Flaming Gorge Dam and Taylor Flat Road (Daggett County)

- b. Add the following sites to the list:
 - i. Pine Creek (Beaver County)
 - ii. Willow Creek (Grand County)
- iii. Willow Creek drainage (Uintah County)4. Applications for muskrat trapping on Waterfowl Management Areas will be on-line only beginning in 2010.
