Trumpeters are not listed as endangered or even a threatened species, other states have tried to implement a season on them and were unsuccessful due to anti-hunting pressure. The Central Flyway portion of Montana has even lifted the restrictions on the taking of Trumpeter swans and we are going backwards?

I also believe you are not comparing apples to apples on bird identification, ducks and geese are highly distinguishable from one another. I have guided and hunted swans for 30 years, if a Trumpeter is silent or not flying with Tundra swans, they can be almost impossible to tell apart on the wing. We have made it unsportsmanlike to land birds and shoot them on the water and this would be the only way to be 100% certain, after viewing it in binoculars to tell them apart.

If we must wait on FWS to come back with isotype testing and by the data I would rather see tag numbers reduced and a closure of the Northern boundary. I would like to see Utah work closely with FWS and push for an increase of study to see what population of Trumpeters we are seeing; do they need to be managed/hunted?

They are also over a mile away from the CWMU and will cause more confusion to the CWMU boundaries. This will cause potential problems for both the CWMU hunters and the public land hunters.

I would like to know if these new parcels are fully fenced on all four sides? From my experience in this area, I don't think it is.

The north parcel (973 acres) has a county class B road through it. It's a good maintained dirt highway.

Pertaining to both the fall management hunt and the depredation tags, I think that allowing an individual that many tags, that have the ability to harvest the breeding hen population is a bit counter-intuitive if the intention is to continue to grow turkey populations throughout the state. I understand that the fall hunt is a very location targeted hunt as well as depredation tags are as well. But being able to remove that many hens in relation to breeding age males just does not make sense when rolling into the following spring's breeding season. I would much rather prefer to see a fall tag allocation of one bearded tag and one beardless tag for hunters as well as the same for depredation permits for landowners. In my experience, turkeys are extremely responsive to hunting pressure and a lot the conflict issues I think could be solved with just allowing hunters to have the ability to be afield pressuring birds that will have a positive affect for conflict issues as well as reducing the total amount of hens lost in the winter months due to hunting that will allow them to be available to breed in the spring. But hunters would still have a couple of tags in their pockets even though one of them is specifically for bearded turkeys (which are much much harder to hunt and harvest in fall months).
